content management platform. He has recently started putting time into contributing to Drupal by helping out in the Drupal core and contrib issue queues, creating patches, rerolls and patch reviews.

## Music In Africa

Charles was contracted to work on the [Music In Africa website](#) in mid 2015 to help fix problems with their Drupal 7 installation. Over the last year, working with [Burtronix](#), and using GitHub for development workflow, the site has been improved and a new design implemented in May 2017. The multilingual site serves all players in the African music industry, allowing artists and service providers to network and to showcase their work.

During the recent update, Charles implemented a feature to allow artists to synchronise their audio tracks from SoundCloud and Deezer using their public API's, allowing these to be played from a custom audio player on the MIA website. These tracks form the core of their [Music page](#). A similar feature for YouTube videos was subsequently implemented, though not using a custom player.

In April and May 2018, Charles added the 2018 Music In Africa Conference section to the site.

The website configuration is managed using the Features module.

## Economic Research Southern Africa (ERSA)

The client can also easily create a MailChimp newsletter from the latest publications and send this to their subscribers from within MailChimp.

## SANGONeT

Development of the [NGO Pulse portal](#). This site was initially migrated from a Joomla site to a Drupal 5 site. It was upgraded to Drupal 6 in 2009, and made considerable use of Organic Groups and Panels for content organisation

and display. Ubercart integration allowing users to purchase ads on the site, as well as emails that get sent out via Everlytic, a local bulk email provider. Varnish was installed on the server to improve performance.

The website has just been moved to Drupal 7. I was not involved with the design of the new site – my responsibility lay in the migration of the content. I used the Migrate, Migrate Drupal to Drupal modules and Drush to migrate the content to a clean Drupal 7 install.

Have been doing less and less work on this site due to changes within the organisation, and my desire to shift focus to Drupal 8, but do occasionally perform security updates for the NGO Pulse site and their 2 other Drupal sites: <http://www.tipfuxeni.org.za/>, and <http://prodder.org.za/>.

#### **Cape Town Green Map and Joburg Green Map**

Maintained both the [Cape Town Green Map](#) and [Joburg Green Map websites](#). Both are Drupal 6 sites which incorporate Google maps to map green locations in Cape Town. The client has the ability to add news items, blog posts, photos, events, tips, links and more. The home page is automatically populated with the latest news and events, while a random header image is displayed each time the page is loaded. Users can submit 'Green Events' and 'Green Tips' for publishing on the site once approved. Facebook is used for comments instead of Drupal's built in comments.

## **GCRO**

[No longer Drupal but left for reference] The academic focused [GCRO website](#) allows the client to communicate their work to stakeholders and the public in general. The site was initially developed using Drupal 6, but upgraded to Drupal 7 in 2013. The Zen 7.x-5.4 theme was used as a basis for the Drupal 7 theme creation, and SASS and Compass (plus Zen Grids) were used too.

The site made use of the Lightbox 2 module for displaying image slideshows (for example: on the [Gallery page](#) and [Vignettes page](#)), while the home page slideshow was set up using Nodequeue, Views Slideshow and Imagecache modules.

The client did not have the budget for a responsive site.

## **The Peer to Peer University (P2PU)**

Took over as lead developer for this Drupal based open education project which allowed anyone to create and participate in courses directly on the website. The site made heavy use of Organic Groups and Panels, Forums, as well as the Context module. Responsibilities included adding of new features, general maintenance, project management with the use of a case tracker (Open Atrium), and managing the work of a second developer. The site has since moved to Django, and the focus of the organisation has shifted to “Learning circles”, but the archived Drupal site still exists at <http://archive.p2pu.org/>
